What is the prompt asking you to do?

This prompt asks me to write an Informative Essay about how the new recycling project helps solve two problems in Côte d'Ivoire.

Introduction

Hook: Grab your readers' attention.

It might be hard to imagine, but you can build a classroom from plastic trash! OR Abidjan, the biggest city in Côte d'Ivoire, creates more than 300 tons of plastic trash each day! OR more than 1-1/2 million children don't go to school in Côte d'Ivoire.

Central Idea: State the big idea your essay will be about.

Transition Sentence: List the two topics you will focus on in your body paragraphs.

The new project helps solve the plastic trash problem by recycling more of the trash. The new project also helps solve the problem of not having enough schools, by building more classrooms.
