# **Plan Your Argument**

Step 1. Read the article and the data sheet carefully. Use quotes and your own words to complete the Planner.

Review the Reading & Prompt
What is the main idea of the article?
The article "Waste Not" is about schools trying different ways to cut down on lunch food waste.
What is the assignment asking you to do?
This prompt asks me to make an argument about whether the principal of my school should keep or get rid of a rule that requires students to take a full lunch.

## Introduce the Topic

Give some background information to let readers know about the topic.

Did you know 30 million students in the US eat school lunch, and at the end of lunch, garbage cans are full of wasted food?

## My Claim

After reviewing the information in the readings, I believe the principal should get rid of the rule saying that students need to take a full lunch, and figure out other ways to make sure they eat a healthy lunch.

## **Reasons & Evidence**

### One Reason That Supports My Claim

#### Evidence That Supports This Reason
